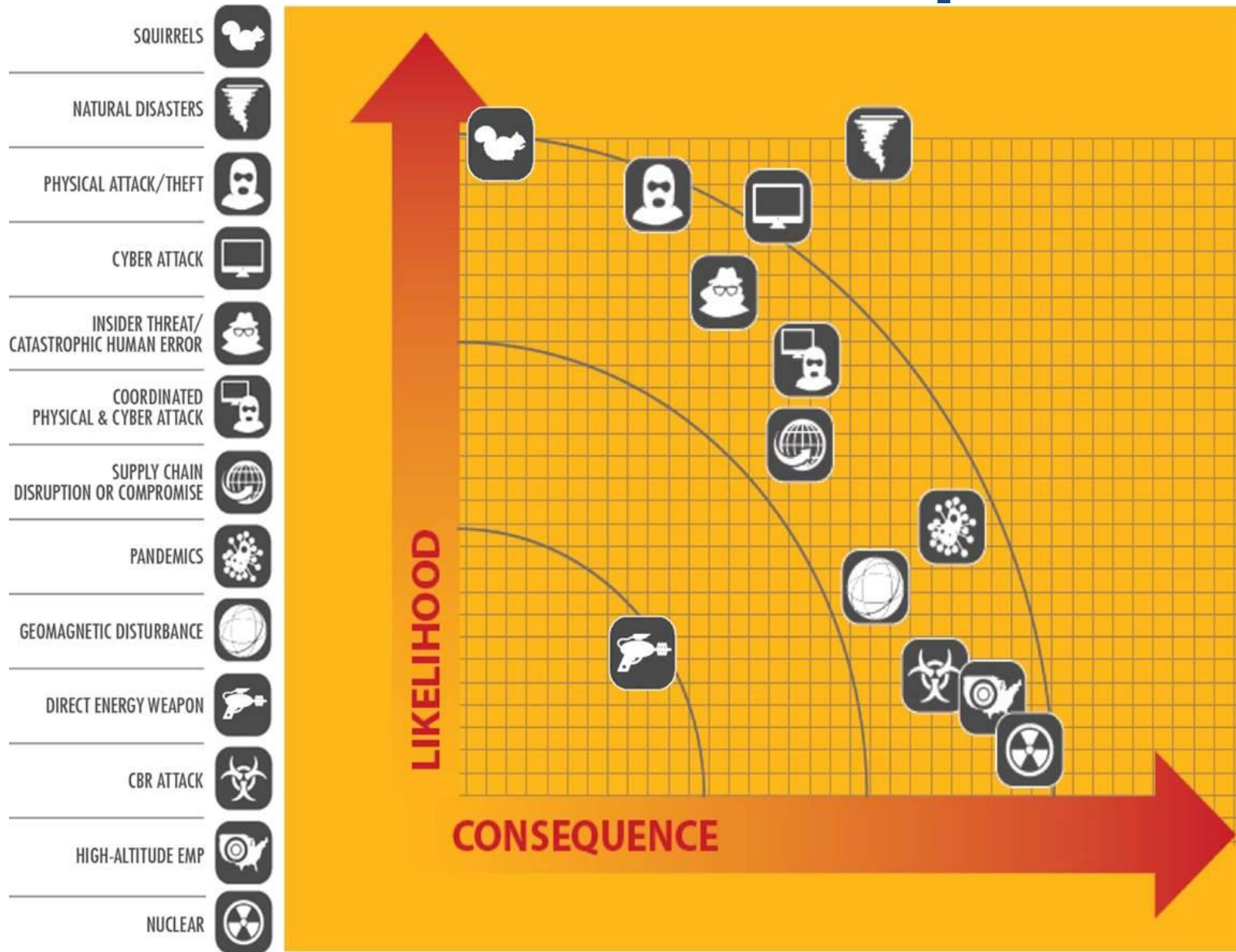

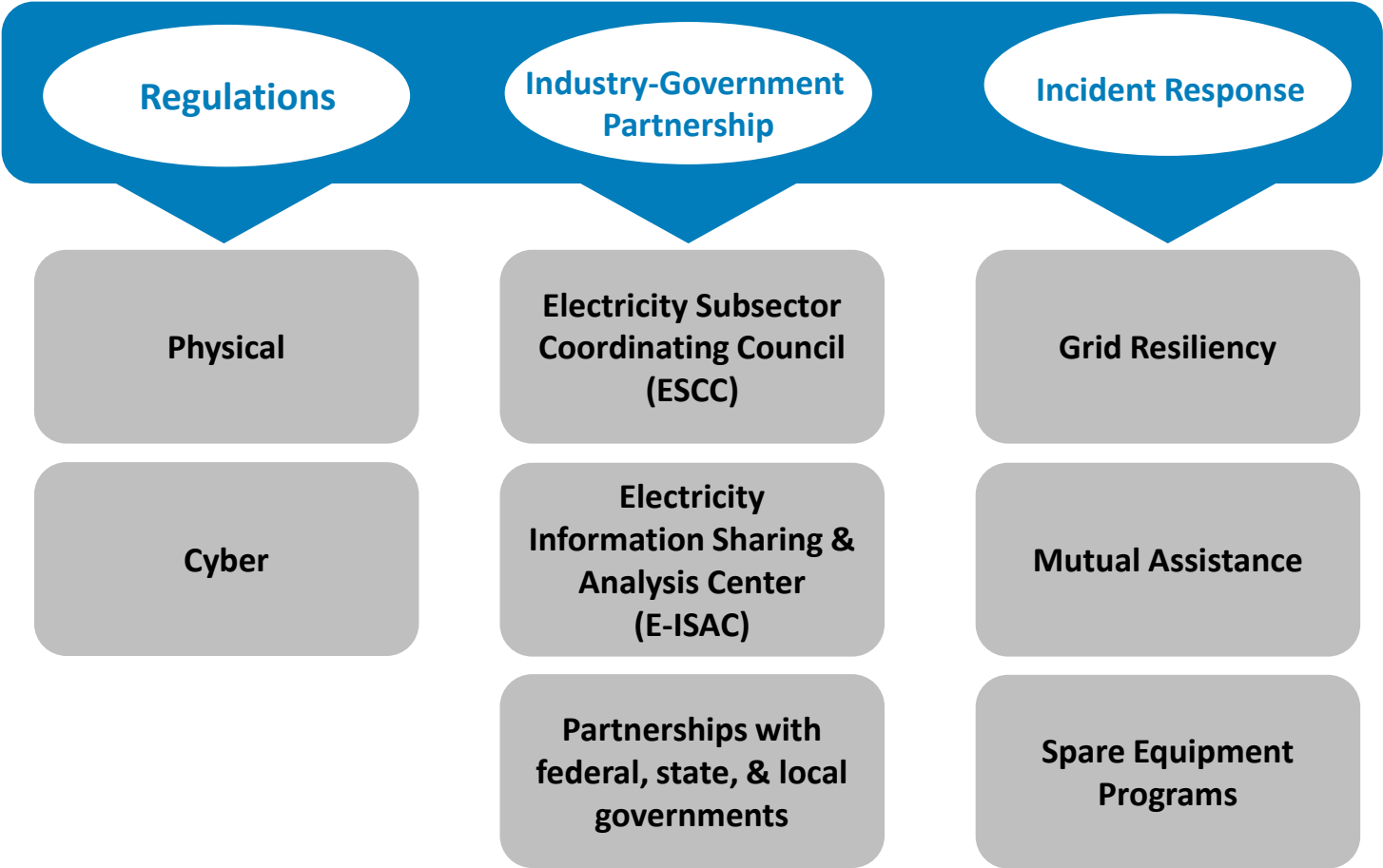

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Purpose

The ESCC is the **principal liaison** between the electric sector and the federal government for coordinating efforts to prepare for, and respond to, national-level disasters or threats to critical infrastructure.

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Cyber Mutual Assistance

Cyber Mutual Assistance Program

provides assistance on a voluntary basis to other participating entities in advance, or in the event of, a disruption of electric service, systems, and/or IT infrastructure due to a cyber emergency
